

Statistics getting worse: 70% of born-again Christians no longer believe in absolute truth

This percentage continues to decline each year in the annual Barna survey. * In addition, statistics are almost as alarming for American Christian pastors across all denominations, averaging 39 percent who believe in absolute truth.

these statistics tell us why a million young adults raised in Christian homes walk away from their faith every year. But one can't entirely blame the kids – stats also indicate only 24 percent of parents of preteens believe in absolute truth.



People not only no longer believe in absolute truth, they don't know how to know if something is true, said Dave Richardson, an apologist who is founder and CEO of Assumptions Institute, and author of *Transparent: How to See Through the Powerful Assumptions That Control You*.

Richardson, an Oxford University-educated thinker, watches these Barna reports annually and has an idea of why these number are falling, but more significantly, has a solution to offer.

People need to learn how to discern truth, Richardson explains.

"First of all," he said, "Today most people, including most Christians, have been taught that the Bible is true only if they accept it as true. The culture today is telling people that something is true only if they believe it is true. And that applies to the Gospel they've known all their life."

"Starting with that confusion, it's no wonder people state they don't believe in absolute truth. They don't know what to believe," he added.

In his work to help people discern truth and engage the culture to influence others for Christ, he landed on this as a starting point: What assumptions are being made?

From there, he developed an innovative and powerful assumptions-based system to teach discernment.

"Almost every parent assumes that discernment is an innate skill that every person has. It isn't! Hebrews 5:14 tells us: 'Solid food is for the mature, who because of practice have their senses trained to discern good and evil.' Scripture is clear that discernment requires training and practice. If you don't train a child and practice with them how to recognize truth, they may never recognize truth even when God and the Bible are the source. "

"Without deliberate coaching to recognize what is true, students will continue to think truth is relative, and too many of them will exit Christianity in ever increasing numbers," he said.

"Learn to Discern is a systematic method to quickly and reliably discern what is and isn't true in classrooms, the media, and the culture," Richardson explains. "It relates Christian thinking to all these things. The result is being able to train both children and adults with this tangible discernment skill."

His intriguing ideas have been praised by Josh McDowell, Eric Metaxas and William Lane Craig.

Richardson's Assumption Institute recently launched Learn to Discern, a new initiative offering online courses they developed for use by Christian schools, home schoolers, individuals and churches or small groups. Available at Learn (learntodiscern.com) the courses provide tools to teach discernment of truth to kids – and adults.

The Critical Assumptions Test (CAT)

He's even created a practical tool for revealing assumptions, the Critical Assumptions Test (CAT) available as an app. The CAT helps people quickly see through the messages they encounter daily in what they read, watch, and hear.

"I want to challenge you to use the Critical Assumptions Test to reveal the assumptions in the books and articles you read, the TV shows and movies you watch, the lectures and talk show debates you listen to, or conversations you have with friends," Richardson says. "Once the assumptions surface, you'll know if they are true or not and if you should accept or reject them. "

After decades with Cru (formerly Campus Crusade for Christ) ministering to university professors, the Oxford University-educated author and speaker started with his development of the study of the assumptions we make in decision making and understanding truth, leading to his creation of Assumptions Institute and his book. A resident of the Atlanta area, Richardson holds a B.A. degree in Interdisciplinary Studies from the University of Portland, an M.A. degree in Theological Studies from the International School of Theology, and an MTh. degree in Applied Theology from the University of Oxford, England.


